The CEOP Command of the National Crime Agency is the UK's national law enforcement agency committed to tackling the sexual abuse and exploitation of children, both online and offline.

CEOP's Thinkuknow education programme reaches over 3 million children and young people every year and empowering them through education. It provides a range of resources for use with children and young people aged 5-17, helping them to identify the risks they may face online, and teaching them how to keep themselves safe and where to seek further support, including reporting directly to CEOP using the **CEOP button**.
